Nordic Village is a visual art talent platform fostered by Helsinki Photo Festival to support emerging Nordic photographers. The platform exhibits visual artists from the countries of the north to a broad audience in Finland and internationally. The program includes educational activities with experts from the Nordics. Now, the platform has initiated a limited edition print program to give Nordic artists access to sell to collectors and fine art lovers around the world.

The limited edition program includes a number of selected international photographers who were exhibited at Helsinki Photo Festival during earlier years.

The exclusive edition is limited to 30 prints per artist only. Each work is signed and numbered with a unique Helphoto Editions label that is supplied separately.

The project is supported by Nordisk Kulturfond, Stockholms Auktionsverk, Marski by Scandic, Finlandia Hall, Hanaholmen - Swedish-Finnish cultural centre and Helsinki Photo Festival.

Stockholms Auktionsverk, the oldest auction house in the world, is the trading partner for this limited edition. Auctions are listed on Auctionet.com.

Marski by Scandic is an award-winning city hotel in the heart of Helsinki. The limited edition will be exhibited in the hotel gallery from January 12 - March 9, 2022.

Hanaholmen is the exhibition and event partner of the Nordic Village during the annual festival period. The next edition with the theme *Believe* will be held from July 7 to October 2, 2022.

Finlandia Hall is one of the most iconic buildings in Helsinki's centre. Spring 2022 a new pavilion-like venue, Little Finlandia will open to the public offering a unique, matchless venue for meetings, congresses and other events. The Finlandia Gallery will be continued in this venue and will exhibit selected works of the limited edition in August 2022.

Helsinki Photo Festival is a non-profit association created to attract interest and disseminate information on photography and visual culture in Finland and abroad.

SVANTE GULLICHSEN (FINLAND) PHOTOGRAPH | 2021

Svante Gullichsen (b.1994) is an emerging photographer from Helsinki. Svante's works are mostly self-portraits taking place in archipelagic and rough natural environments. His style varies from strong Nordic and mystical atmospheres to warm and insightful expeditions. At the very core, Gullichsen's work is presenting mental health issues through the relation between human and nature as well as the fundamental relation between darkness and light. Svante's first solo exhibition "Hangin on" with works he made from 2016-2020 was displayed at the beginning of the year 2021 in Tampere's Photographic center Nykyaika and received a lot of positive attention in the media. His second solo exhibition "Fearless" was on display at the Nordic Village 2021 in the Art park at Hanaholmen Swedish-Finnish Cultural Centre and seen by over 20-thousand spectators. All images were new creations made during the winter season of 2020 in Lapland to the spring period of 2021 on Jurmo Island and Porvoo. Gullichsen is fearless. He finds comfort in dangerous situations. It makes his body's full alertness feel justified. Although many of Svante's works are self-portraits, a number of new masterpieces feature multiple participants. These introduce the viewers in new ways to his world and depict his reflections on the personal processes he is dealing with and the things that make him feel alive.




SARI SOININEN (FINLAND) PHOTOGRAPH | 2020

Sari Soininen (b.1991, Raisio) is a Finnish photographer based in Bristol, United Kingdom. Her colorful otherworldly photography draws from philosophical thoughts and personal mystical experiences. Her interest is in providing the viewer with alternative ways of seeing the reality and world around them.

In her early twenties, Sari experimented with LSD regularly and excessively. She eventually experienced an extended psychotic episode, which had serious consequences on her own life. During this time, she abandoned all her worldly possessions. Sari confronted demons and observed wonders. Transcendent Country of the Mind represents this new perspective. They explore perceptions of otherworldly signs around us. The images tell the story of a world that lives at the back of our minds.

Sari holds a BA in photography from Lahti Institute of Design (2014), and is currently studying MA Photography at UWE Bristol (2021). Sari is an emerging artist with her latest work shortlisted for British Photography Awards. In 2021, she was exhibited at the Nordic Village at Helsinki Photo Festival and Copenhagen Photo Festival. She was featured in FT Weekend Magazine, Helsingin Sanomat and Libération Magazine.

ANNE LASS (DENMARK/GERMANY) ANALOGUE | 2020

CARL-MIKAEL STRÖM (SWEDEN) DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPH | 2020

Carl-Mikael Ström (b. 1986, in Sweden) lives and works between Sweden and France. He studied photography at Fatamorgana in Copenhagen, Denmark, between 2013-2014. He was an assistant to the Swedish photographer JH Engström between 2014-2018. Ström works within photography, writing, and film. He moves between the different mediums, using time as his essential tool to let the frame of the project become visible. Intrigued by what cannot be explained through language his work revolves around the question: "What is there that can be shown but cannot be said?" He believes that an image has endless forms and that time passing inevitably shows, even in an image. Convinced that there is always more behind what you intend to say, he tries to accept the restraints and lies of creations. "Inevitably it will rain" is a chapter in Ström's project Brightness Hiding (The Failure... is based upon a quote by Ludwig Wittgenstein: "What can be shown, cannot be said" In this project Ström wishes to challenge the idea that photography is a language and wants to ask the viewer: What is there that can be shown but cannot be said? What we see when we look at something is a reflection of our cultural knowledge, learnings, language, and life experiences. It is from this singular view that we interpret what we see. Ström was an open call finalist with this series at Nordic Village 2020 and will have a solo exhibition at Hanaholmen Gallery in Espoo during Helsinki Photo Festival 2022.

LISA PRAM NIELSEN (DENMARK) DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPH | 2020

Lisa Pram was born in a crisis. Car-free Sundays due to the oil crisis in the mid 70's Denmark are among her very early memories. A personal identity crisis in her teenage years pushed Lisa to travel around Europe and immerse herself into photography, film, and literature, while a violent motorbike traffic accident as a young adult forced her to sit still as she recovered by the Spanish Mediterranean coast. Lisa is convinced that these crises helped her become the photographer she is today. Friction, ambiguity, and contradiction are the tools she works with and uses to dismantle pillars of dogma and monolithic certainties. From there, she builds her creative discourse, which weaves into many branches and does not point to any particular truth, but focuses on doubt, uncertainty, and an open attitude to change. Lisa has balanced to unite photography, film, and literary projects since 2001. Curiosity and constant experimentation keep her moving forward. Whether it is fine art photography, people or portrait photography, her approach is easily recognizable and is situated within the concept of uncertainty, as it has formed her as an artist and as a person.




ÓMAR SVERRISSON (ICELAND) PHOTOGRAPH | 2018

The series Inanimate is about the cruel relationship between humans and nature. Through small installations that are documented through photography, the project reflects on how the control that humans have on their surroundings hurts both nature and humans themselves. The environment humans have lived in for thousands of years has long been seen as an inanimate area. Nature has been a large resource that humans have used due to the ever growing lust for financial growth and expansion. The project is inspired by the term Anthropocene which can be described as a new geological epoch. This geological epoch describes how humans have affected their surroundings and the diverse ecosystems around them. Olsen aims to portray the lifelessness, control, pain and cruelty with which humans have treated their own environment with. The plants are placed in an environment where they can be controlled but also stand out. Olsen has let curiosity drive him forward in the project, which has created possibilities for experimentation and new results.




